  - a. Clubs Present: Metchosin, Beagle, Stonewallers, Wicket Maidens, Pig's Trotters, Ross Bay, MCC, Spinnakers.

- IV. Vice Presidents report by Rohan Gowda
  - a. Rohan thanks the executive for the work put into the past season. Touches on the success on the decision to move into a two-tiered league.
- V. Treasures report by Arnav Nagpal
  - a. All clubs have paid in full
  - b. 9 clubs have claimed the \$300 credit towards cricket related paraphernalia. The remaining clubs that did not claim the \$300 can still do so moving into the next season.
- VI. Secretary's report by Kevin Sommerfeldt
  - a. Everything ran smoothly and happy that no issues arose with the scheduling as we moved into two tiers. Thank you to all clubs for your patience in the arrival of the pink balls.
- VII. VDCA report by Graham Smith
  - a. The only issues that arose from the VDCA AGM were contentious issues with umpires – primarily umpires not showing up to assignments.
  - b. The VDCA elected a new secretary – Mr. Suhan Kumar Alagaratnam.
- VIII. Nominations for Executives
  - a. President: Douglas de la Mare continues into another term of Presidency. There were no other nominations.
  - b. Vice President: Rohan Gowda continues as Vice President. There were no other nominations.
  - c. 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President: Keith Harris is nominated by Rohan Gowda and seconded Ross Sands. There were no other nominations.
  - d. Secretary: Kevin Sommerfeldt continues as secretary. There were no other nominations.
  - e. Treasurer: In a shocking turn of events, Arnav Nagpal retires from his post as Treasurer. Financially responsible Ross Sands is nominated by Douglas

de la Mare and seconded by Kevin Sommerfeldt. There were no other nominations.

- f. VDCA Representative: Graham Smith continues as VDCA Rep. There were no other nominations.

#### IX. New Business

- a. Discuss two-tiered league – comments/concerns?
  - i. Feedback about the move to two-tiers in the schedule was a resounding success. The only feedback is to narrow the length of the schedule to end earlier in the year – this is primarily based on light concerns in September.
- b. Midweek Dues
  - i. Midweek dues will continue to be the same as the previous season. \$550 per club.
- c. Registration forms and player fees
  - i. Registration is \$25 per player. We will be collecting a \$250 deposit to cover the first 10 players.
- d. Schedule
  - i. Preliminary schedule will be released at Captains Meeting
- e. Pink vs white balls for Regular Season & Knockout tournament
  - i. We received some hate mail regarding the pink balls that we trialed last season – the fans couldn't see the ball!
  - ii. We may trial a neon green coloured ball if we can find them for a reasonable price, otherwise we will be moving back to a white ball.
  - iii. We still have a reserve of pink balls from the previous season, so we will be using these up before we transition, either way.
- f. Select games & Six Aside Oldum Brown tournament
  - i. Unfortunately, we were not able to fit these into the schedule last season. We will try our best to include these into the coming season, although it will be tough with VISAS. Much of this depends on the structure of the Weekend league schedule.
- g. Wicket Maidens Game Style
  - i. The Wicket Maidens have confirmed signings of 17 women as of their AGM.
  - ii. The Wicket Maidens have requested to go back to a handicapped system – previously they had their total runs doubled. This is to create a more competitive atmosphere.
  - iii. Additionally, there is a request to move games away from Fridays. WM matches will occur @ Beacon Hill on Tue or Thur evenings (to be confirmed at Captain's Meeting)

- h. Any other business
  - i. Sidney ground is confirmed for 2018 season.
  - ii. Possibly adding another day during the week @ Windsor Park – to be confirmed. We are also looking into hosting more games at UVic.
  - iii. There is potentially a new club joining the league for the 2018 season – to be confirmed.
